





# Filling Squares with Point to Point Triangles

P2P Triangle patterns can be placed into squares in several ways. The simplest is the half square arrangement, with two patterns mirrored across the diagonal.

To place the patterns as shown, choose a P2P Triangle pattern and select Point to Point Pattern function on the toolbar. These two patterns are called Baseballs and Hummingbird Garden. Click the UL corner, LR corner and then the UL corner again. The block will be filled with a pattern that is mirrored, but with different corners.







## Quarter Square Arrangement

Placing four triangle patterns in a square block will create a design that is more dense and more complex visually.


Choose a P2P Triangle pattern you like and select the Point to Point Pattern function on the toolbar. Begin by clicking the LL corner, then LR, UR, UL and finally LL again. Four triangle patterns will fill the block.

A mirrored image always makes a pleasing design no matter which pattern you choose.



## Eight Patterns in a Square

Even more complex, eight P2P Triangle patterns in a square will create an exciting design from even the simplest of patterns. This one is called Sew Simple. Choose a P2P Triangle pattern and select the P2P Pattern function on the toolbar. Begin in the UL corner and follow the pink dots to see how the triangle patterns were placed.



Keep in mind that "one square" does not necessarily mean one patchwork square. It can be any area of the quilt that you can define with this underlying structure for placement points.
