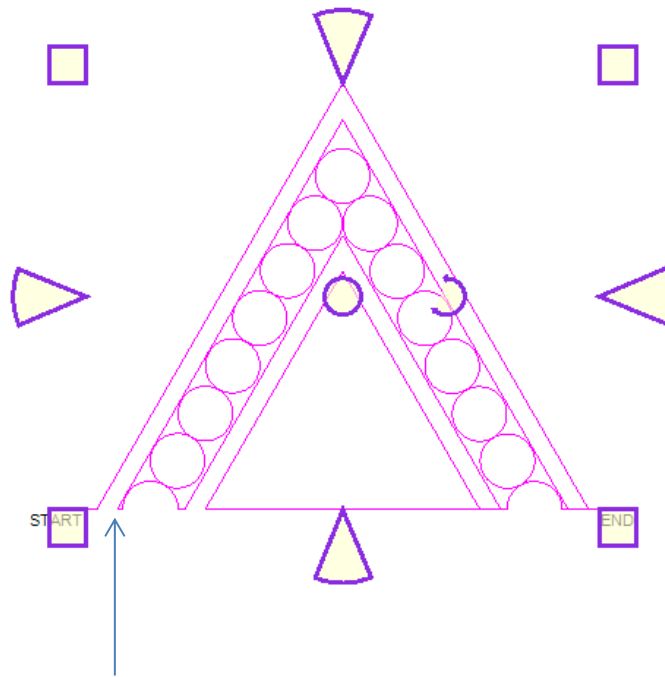

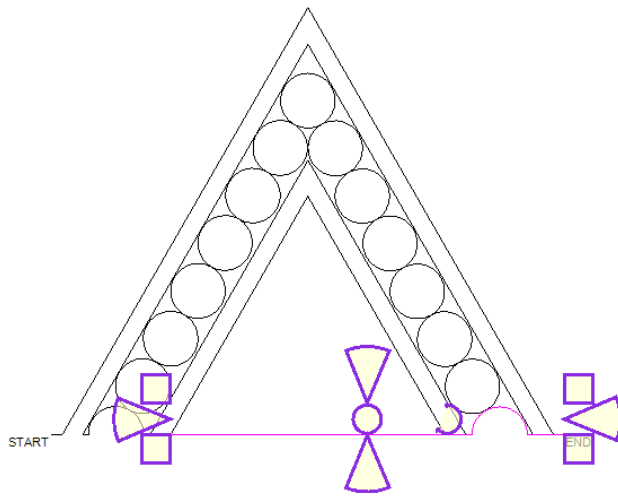
## How-To Create a P2P Triangle using the Modular Design (MD) Channel 60 Degree Pearls P2P Triangle Base and an MD Channel 60 Degree Inside P2P Triangle

---

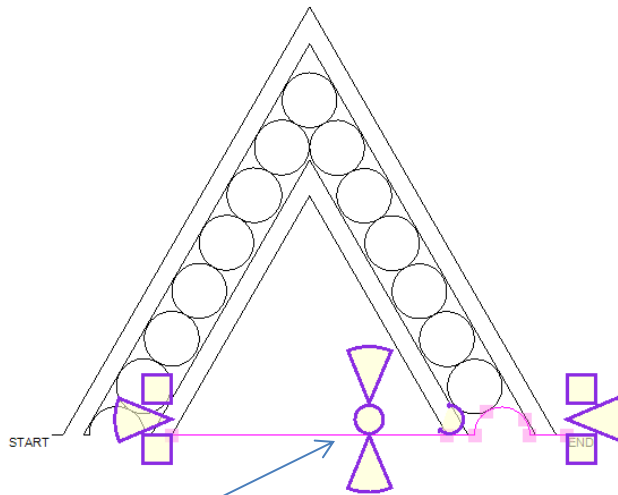
1. Select the MD Channel 60 Degree Pearls P2P Triangle Base design and place on CAD using Repeat Patterns. Select the pattern, right click and choose “Divide Pattern”



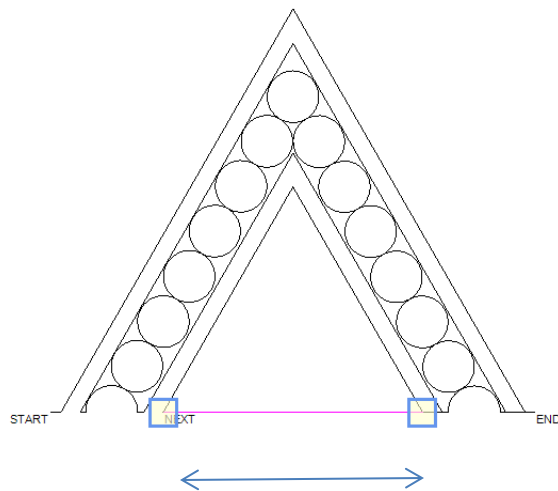
2. Zoom in and click on divide node #1



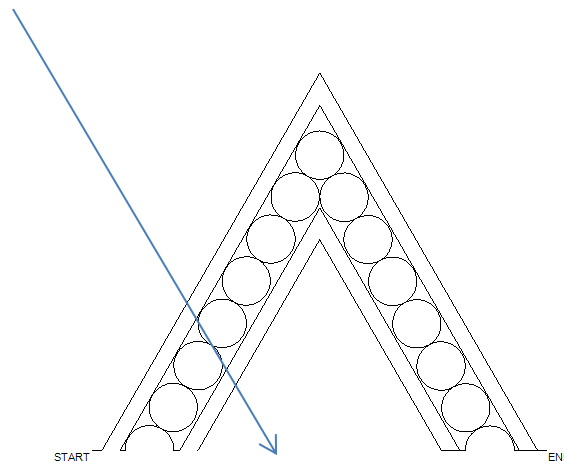
3. Select the divided bottom part of the pattern – Right Click – Select Divide



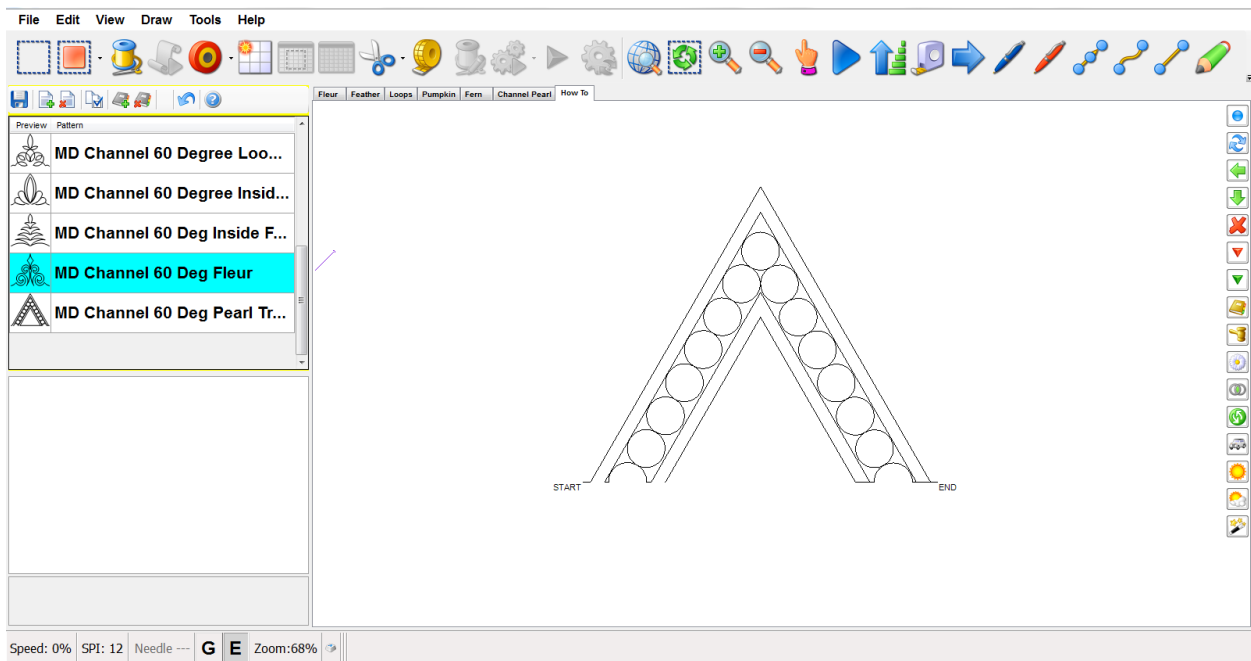
4. Click on divide node #2



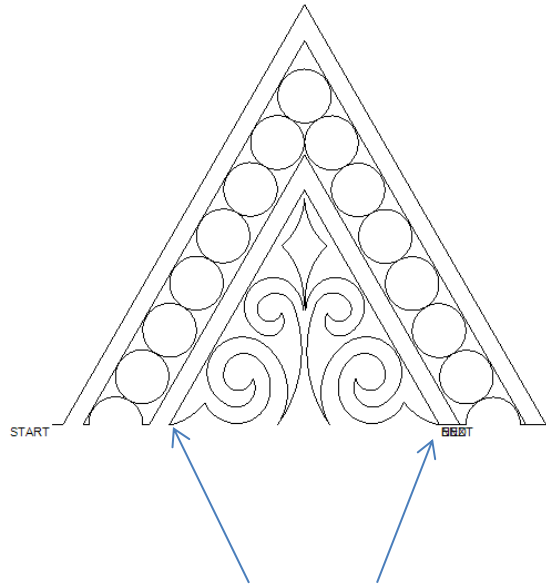
5. With the inside divided line selected, right click and delete the line. (It should be just the line that is the base of the inside triangle space.)



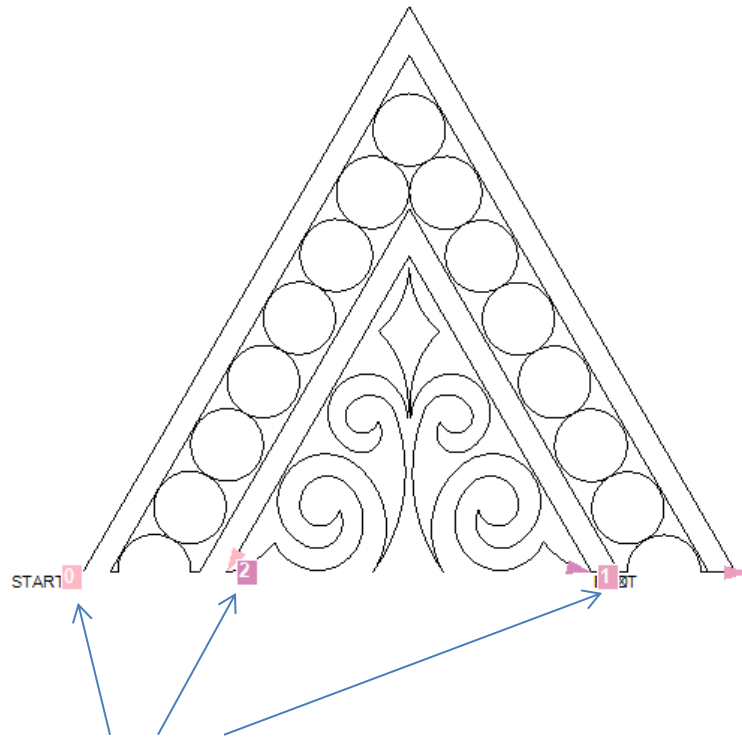
6. Select an MD Channel 60 Deg inside design. (In this example we have used the MD Channel 60 Deg Fleur )



7. Turn on End Snap using "E" on your keyboard ( or by using your mouse and clicking on the E at the bottom of the CAD)



8. Click on P2P Pattern and Click the two base points for your P2P triangle – clicking the left point first.

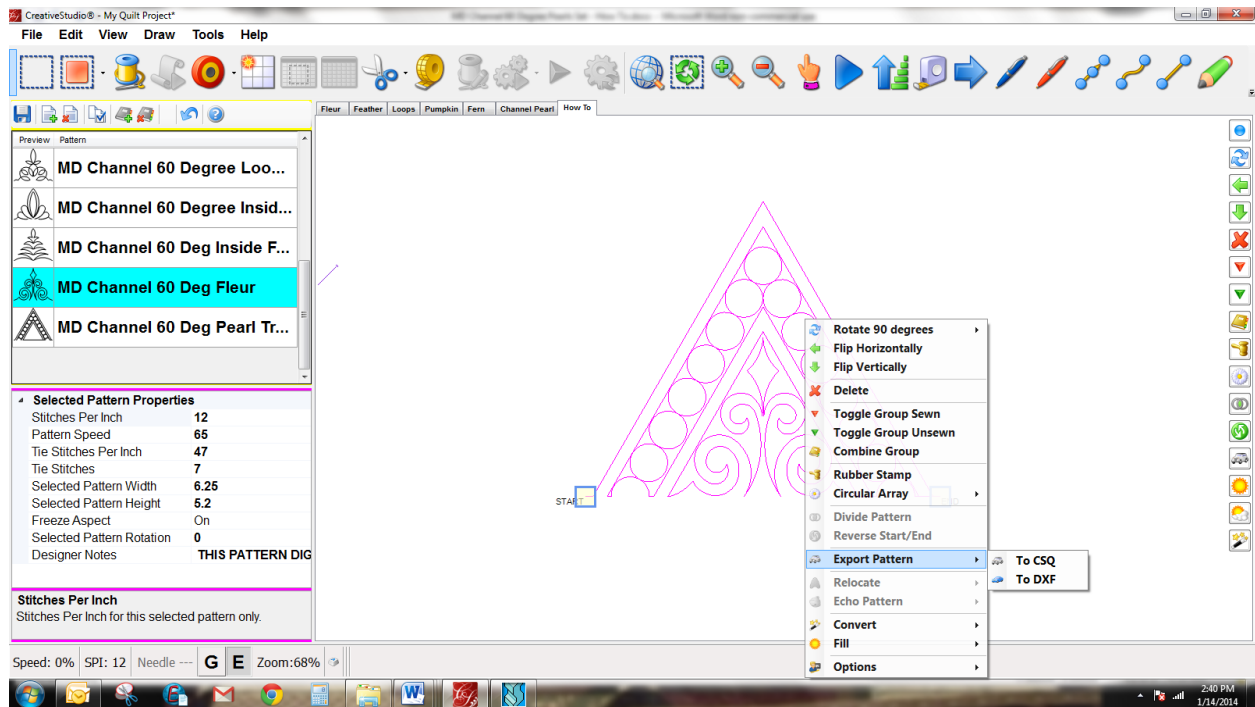


9. Press F8 to Set Sew Order, 0, 1, 2 and then **press F8 to commit.**

10. Press F2 – Virtual Stitchout to verify the pattern will stitch continuous. Press Esc to exit Virtual Stitchout

11. Select pattern – Right click and choose Export Pattern – To CSQ - I named this pattern –

Remember – you will only ever have to do this once for each P2P Triangle Base design and 60 Degree inside triangle combination you want to create. You might consider setting up a folder on your computer to store your Modular Designs... and if you have PVM – don't forget to import these new designs.

Now you have a set of six different MD Channel 60 Degree Pearl P2P Triangles. Use them to make diamonds, blocks, hexagons, stars and borders. There are so many different ways they can be used.
