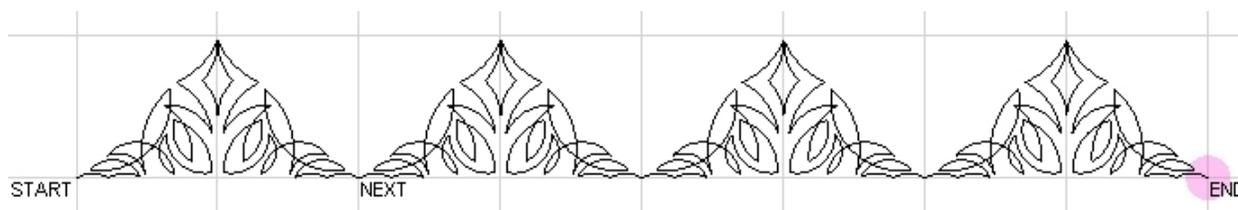


P2P T riangle Patterns for an E 2E Look

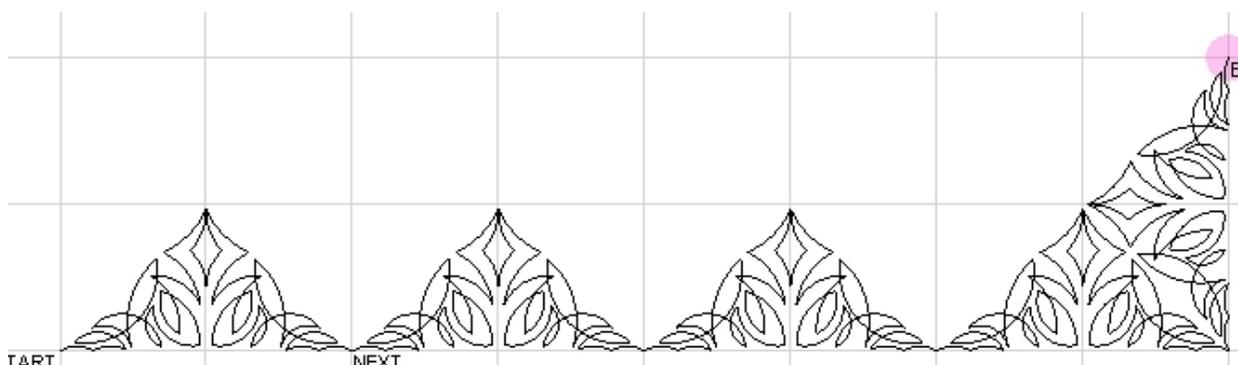

Careful placement of P2P Triangle patterns can be used to layout an E2E pattern that will look like custom quilting when it is finished. The secret is a combination of how the patterns are designed and how they are placed on the quilt. Following is very basic instruction on Page's technique (printed with her permission, of course). 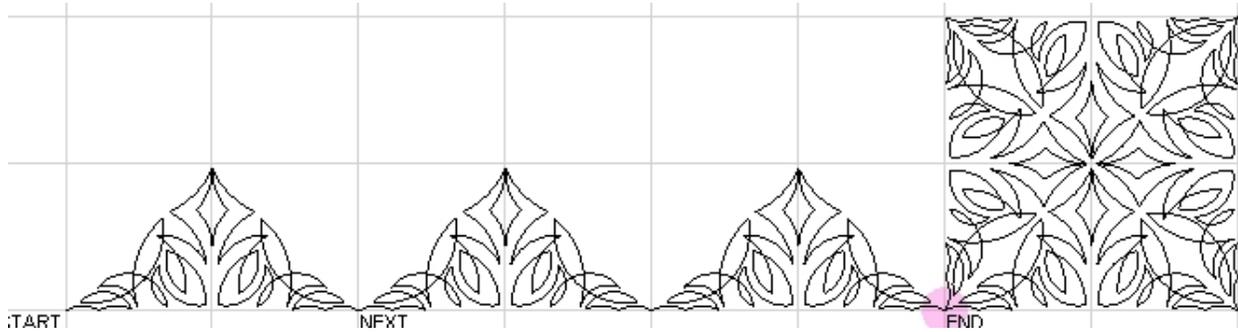
To begin, choose a P2P Triangle pattern and select the Point to Point Pattern function on the toolbar. This pattern is called Hummingbird Garden. Begin clicking at the LL corner of the first row and click the bottom corners of each block, all the way across the quilt.



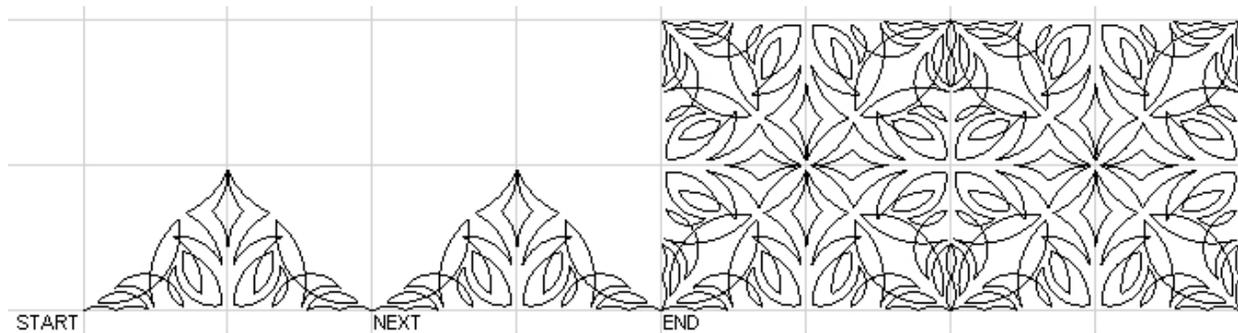
When you reach the last LR corner, move to click the UR corner of the last block.



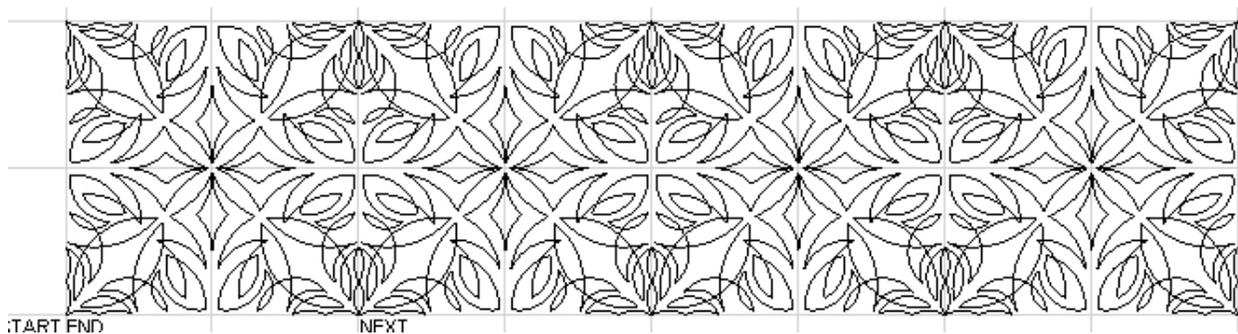
Begin to work your way back across the top of the row, but in this pass, you will also set the patterns that will fill in the remainder of each block. Follow the diagram below to click the UL and LL corners of the first block. One block will be complete.



Click the UR, UL and LL, as shown, to fill the second block.



Continue with this pattern of clicks until the entire first row of blocks is complete.



Depending on the height of the rows, you may have enough available throat space to mark a second row. If you click all of the points without stopping, the patterns will sew in a continuous line.
